Job Summary:

This position is responsible for providing Individual, group and family mental health services. Provide therapeutic counseling services within an ambulatory health care setting to assist people manage and overcome mental and emotional disorders and distress within family and other relationships. Provide a safe, responsive, comfortable, and supportive environment to help clients understand their problems and develop strategies to improve their lives and sense of wellbeing.

Duties/Responsibilities:

- Assesses, diagnoses, and develops outpatient treatment interventions with clients utilizing DSMV, best practice treatment modalities, psychoeducation, in a culturally competent approach.
- Attend regularly scheduled monthly collaboration sessions with integrative care team including AODA, Medical Director, and Clinical Supervisors.
- Facilitates therapeutic groups, community education, and mediation sessions.
- Completes accurate, complete, and timely documentation of client care, interactions, and communications per standard of practice for mental health practice in the State of Wisconsin, Sokaogon Chippewa Community Health Clinic Policies and Procedures, and licensure requirements within electronic health record.
- Provides maintenance of confidential behavioral health records per State of Wisconsin, Sokaogon Chippewa Community Health Clinic Policies and Procedures, and licensure requirements within electronic health record.
- Improves and develops provider protocols, policies/procedures along with collaborative team members for continuous improvement in care delivery for behavioral health services.
- Performs standardized and appropriate client evaluations for continued treatment and readiness for discharge and aftercare.
- Formulates and implements care plans which may involve various treatment modalities, consultation with other health care providers, and referrals as needed.
- Recommends appropriate follow up to clients, family members, and collaborative team members.
- Collaborates with other health care professionals to develop treatment protocol, standards of practice, and health care services policy.

- Collaborates with other referring professionals for advocacy, case management, communication and documentation of attendance and progress with ROI on file and informed consent with client.
- Maintains professional certifications and improves professional knowledge through seminars, accredited courses and in-service education.
- Completes all other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- Master's Degree level is required.
- Active, current and unrestricted license to practice in the state of Wisconsin.
- Minimum of two years' experience preferred.
- AODA experience and credential a plus (AODA specialty or SAC or higher).
- Knowledge of Native American communities/culture or willingness to learn.
- Excellent verbal, written and presentation skills.
- Ability to work independently.
- Ability to be credentialed with Medicare and Medicaid
- Valid driver's license
